We need to get Australia back on track – and my Coalition colleagues and I have a plan to do just that, as I have touched on in this newsletter.

LABOR'S GOVERNMENT SERVICES FAILURE

Many of us in Bradfield need to seek government support – and that means dealing with Services Australia for Medicare claims, age pensions and other social services payments. As Shadow Minister for Government Services, I keep a close eye on this vital agency.

Unfortunately, service levels at Services Australia have collapsed under Labor.

If you apply for the Age Pension, you are waiting on average **60 days** to have it processed, compared to 35 days when the Coalition was last in Government.

If you apply for the Disability Support Pension, you are **waiting 81 days** on average for it to be processed, compared to 40 days under the Coalition.

If you call Services Australia, the experience is just as bad with almost **two million Australians kept on hold** for longer than 60 minutes during FY 2023-24.

With many Australians struggling because of the cost of living crisis, poor service from Services Australia makes it worse.

The Albanese Labor Government needs to do better.

TRANSPORT AND INFRASTRUCTURE

- Delivered the \$3 billion **NorthConnex** project, opened in 2020, with over \$412 million of Commonwealth funding, reducing congestion on Pennant Hills Road and bringing quicker and safer trips for motorists
- Provided \$1.7 billion under the Asset Recycling Scheme towards the new Metro – Chatswood to Sydenham which is transforming how Bradfield locals travel to the CBD and beyond
- Delivered over \$12.9 million in funding under the Roads to Recovery and Black Spot programs for over 70 local road projects to increase safety and reduce congestion

EDUCATION

 Under the Quality Schools Package, delivered increased Commonwealth funding to schools in Bradfield, reaching \$123 million a year in 2021 – up by 59.7% for government schools, 43.1% for Catholic schools, and 19.1% for independent schools

HEALTHCARE

- Doubled funding for public hospitals from \$13.3 billion in 2012-13 to \$27.2 billion in 2022-23, growing to \$32.7 billion in 2025-26
- We brought 2,900 new or amended life-saving and life-changing

PAUL FLETCHER and the LIBERALS Delivering OUTCOMES FOR BRADFIELD



TRANSPORT AND INFRASTRUCTURE

The former Coalition Government supported 120,000 jobs through a record \$120 billion ten-year infrastructure pipeline across Australia, with significant projects in Bradfield.

I helped deliver funding to build NORTHCONNEX, 9km motorway tunnels linking the M1 Pacific Motorway at Wahroonga to the Hills M2 Motorway, getting trucks off the road and bypassing 21 traffic lights on Pennant Hills Road.

Our record of delivery includes local road upgrades to ease congestion, improve safety for all road users, and enhance freight productivity for businesses through our Local Roads and Community Infrastructure, Roads to Recovery, and Black Spot programs.



COMMUNITY PROJECTS

Under our Stronger Communities Programme, we provided grants to community and volunteer organisations to buy new equipment, increase volunteers and upskill. Significant funding was delivered to Willoughby City Council and Ku-Ring-Gai Council for small capital projects that deliver social benefits to our community.

I was pleased to secure federal funding for the Ku-Ring-Gai Youth Development Service (KYDS) based in Lindfield and StreetWork based in Willoughby, to help these organisations deliver vital support services for our local young people.





HOUSING

First home buyers reached record levels (over 180,000 in 2020-21) thanks to the Coalition government's policies. Our housing plan will build on this record, encourage first home buyers and take the pressure off interest rates.

The Liberals will allow Australians to access up to \$50,000 of their super to buy their first home and extend this policy to separated women to help restart their lives. The money initially withdrawn from super will need to be returned when the house is sold to support retirement.



THE ENVIRONMENT

We have a beautiful natural environment in Bradfield, but there is more to do, such as adding to the local green space and retaining our tree canopy.

Safeguarding our national parklands, sporting ovals and community parks is vital to meet environmental, sporting and community needs for current and future residents in Bradfield.

Working with our community to achieve these outcomes is a priority for me.


