A MESSAGE FROM Paul Fletcher MP

Late last year I announced that I will retire from parliament at the coming election. It has been a privilege to represent the people of Bradfield for over 15 years. But now it is time to pass the baton on.

I am confident our impressive Liberal candidate for Bradfield, Gisele Kapterian, has what it takes to do a great job representing Bradfield and delivering outcomes for our community.

Since Gisele was chosen as our Liberal candidate, I have been working closely with her to make sure our community is heard in Canberra.

We are hearing a very clear message: Bradfield locals want to see the back of this chaotic Albanese Labor Government and the cost of living crisis it has triggered.

The reason why the cost of everything has gone up is because since the last election, Labor has added an additional \$347 billion in wasteful spending.

This election there is a clear choice: another three years of a big taxing, big spending Albanese Labor Government - in partnership with the Greens and the Teals - or a Coalition Government with a plan to get Australia back on track.

Labor has brought the longest ever per capita recession in Australia at 21 months, 12 consecutive interest rate rises, and household budgets struggling with prices up over 10% for everything.

At this election there is a clear choice: another three years of a big taxing, big spending Albanese Labor Government in partnership with the Greens and the Teals - or a Coalition Government with a plan to get Australia back on track.

Be in no doubt: a vote for the Teal candidate is a vote for three more years of chaos under a Labor-Teals-**Greens minority government.**

By contrast, the Coalition's plan will:

- Boost local jobs and businesses
- Make housing more affordable
- Deliver better roads and transport, and
- Improve health and government services that the community relies upon.

BRADFIELD HOUSING

Community Forum Fig

On Sunday, 2 March 2025, I will be attending a forum to be held by Gisele Kapterian to discuss the Coalition's response to Labor's housing crisis.

Locals are invited to attend and share their views on the rising costs of rents, mortgages, supply, difficulty saving up for deposits, and community consultation.

We need decisive action to fight the housing crisis. Housing is one of the biggest issues facing Australia, but sadly many have given up on the dream of home ownership.

Labor's promise to build 12 million homes is in tatters, as building approvals dropped to the lowest levels in 12 years and costs of construction skyrocket.

The Coalition approach will:

- Boost home building across Australia by funding critical infrastructure
- End Labor's corporate housing agenda in favour of individual home ownership
- Allow first home buyers to access up to 40% or \$50,000 of their superannuation to help fund a deposit on a home, the biggest asset to securing Australian families' futures.

Key points that locals raise in these discussions will contribute to the development of the Coalition's housing policy, particularly for supply and affordability at a local level.

A TRACK RECORD OF DELIVERING FOR BRADFIELD

TRANSPORT AND INFRASTRUCTURE

- Opened the NorthConnex project in 2020, with over \$412 million of Commonwealth funding – taking trucks off local roads and bringing quicker and safer trips for motorists
- Provided \$1.7 billion towards the new
 Metro Chatswood to Sydenham
 under the Asset Recycling Scheme, which is transforming how Bradfield locals travel to the CBD and beyond
- Delivered over \$12.9 million under the Roads to Recovery and Black Spot programs for over 70 local road projects.



EDUCATION

 The Coalition's Quality Schools Package delivered increased Commonwealth funding to schools in Bradfield, reaching \$123 million a year in 2021 – up 59.7% for government schools, 43.1% for Catholic schools, and 19.1% for independent schools.



HEALTHCARE

- **Doubled funding** for public hospitals from \$13.3 billion in 2012-13, to \$27.2 billion in 2022-23, and growing to \$32.7 billion in 2025-26
- We brought 2,900 new or amended life-saving and life-changing medicines onto the Pharmaceuticals Benefits Scheme
- Introduced **Telehealth**, providing services to over 17 million people since its introduction in 2020.

New tax deduction for small businesses

Recently I joined Opposition Leader Peter Dutton, Deputy Opposition Leader Sussan Ley, and Liberal candidate Gisele Kapterian, visiting hospitality businesses to hear about the impact of the cost of living crisis.

Cafes, restaurants, clubs and pubs are the lifeblood of so many local economies around the country.

And yet like so many businesses at the moment, they are hurting under Labor with skyrocketing electricity, gas and insurance prices.

Under Labor more than 26,000 small businesses have gone to the wall. More than 4,000 of those were in hospitality.

That is why a Dutton Coalition Government will cut red tape for small businesses by introducing a capped tax deduction of \$20,000 for business-related meal and entertainment expenses.

Small businesses with a turnover of up to \$10 million will be eligible and alcohol will be excluded from the policy. The measure will run for an initial two years and be exempt from Fringe Benefits Tax.
